

New mobile computer lab planned

Access to computers is becoming more and more important in the education process for children. At Ruppenthal Middle School, a recent grant is providing more laptop computers which can be made available for students to use.

Unified School District teachers Nancy

Underwood, Laurie Barney, and Haley Krehbiel formed a team which completed the application for a grant recently provided through the Russell County Area Community Foundation. The grant provided \$9,000, with no matching funds required.

This grant enabled the

purchase of a new mobile computer lab, containing 10 laptop terminals. This lab will be based on the second floor of Ruppenthal Middle School. That floor previously had no mobile computer labs.

Underwood said until now, RMS had two mobile computer labs.

One is based on the building's third floor, and the other is based in the school's sixth grade wing.

RMS now has a greater number of computers which students can use to learn all kinds of school subjects, such as math reading, and science.
